

Tiebreaking Procedure. The following procedure will be used to establish postseason seeding when two or more teams are tied.

1. ***For divisions that play a round-robin schedule*** (i.e. each team plays every other team at least once). If at the conclusion of one of the listed steps, two teams remain tied, return to step A.

- A. Results of head-to-head competition during the regular season among the tied teams.
- B. Each team's record vs. the team occupying the highest position in the final regular-season standings, and then continuing down through the standings until one team gains an advantage.

When arriving at another group of tied teams while comparing records, use each team's record against the collective tied teams as a group (prior to that group's own tie-breaking procedure), rather than the performance against individual tied teams.

- C. A draw conducted by the League Commissioner (or designee).

2. ***For divisions that do not play a round-robin schedule.***

If at the conclusion of one of the listed steps, two teams remain tied, return to step A.

- A. Results of head-to-head competition during the regular season among the tied teams. If all tied teams did not play each other, this item cannot be used.
- B. Won-Loss record against common opponents.
- C. Won-Loss record of all opponents (Strength of Schedule).
- D. A draw conducted by the League Commissioner (or designee).
