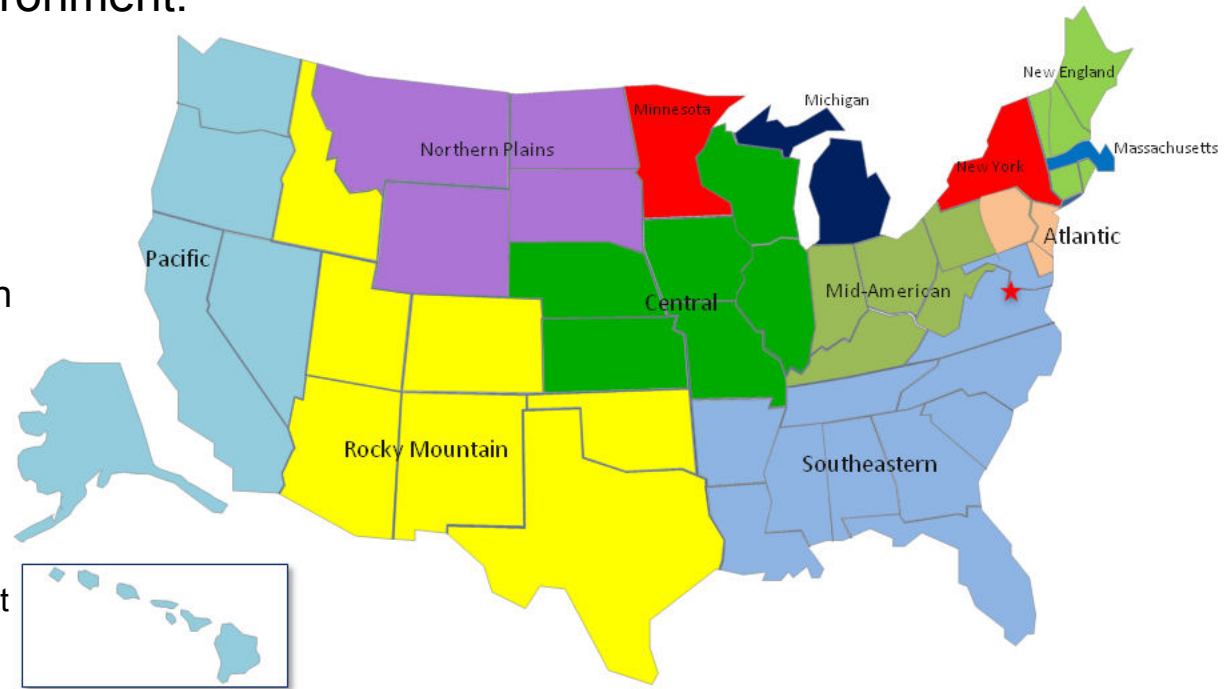


CCYHA is the Second Largest Youth Hockey Program of its kind in the Mid-Am District

House Program

- The CCYHA House Hockey Program offers a first rate developmental hockey program for boys and girls at the Mini-mite through Bantam level.
- Highlights:
 - CCYHA mid-year all day tournaments for Mini-mites, Mites and Squirts
 - Two-tiered Squirt, Peewee and Bantam league with four other Columbus area hockey associations (Columbus House Hockey competing for the Columbus Cup)
 - Optional travel weekend for out-of-town/State tournament
 - Exclusive partnership with Accelerate Ohio (Skating treadmill)
 - Select teams for Mites, Squirts and Peeweess
 - End of Year awards
 - Players keep jerseys
 - In 2011-2012 season, Squirt Wild took home the Columbus Cup in the Squirt Major Division and the Peewee Lightning took home the Columbus Cup in the PW Minor Division.
 - American Development Model (ADM) fully implemented for Mini-mites and transitioned during 2011-2012 season for Mites.



Tier II Travel Blue Jackets Program

- CCYHA offers both AA and A travel teams at all age levels (Squirt through Bantam)
- CCYHA Travel Hockey is committed to the long-term development of its players by providing competitive opportunities to these players at the appropriate levels.
- Highlights:
 - Teams coached by professional skills coaches
 - AA Teams (Peewee and Bantam) coached by full-time professional coaches
 - All teams coordinated with Blue Jackets travel apparel
 - Play in the Little Caesar's, Buckeye Travel or Cleveland Suburban Hockey Leagues
 - Host of the Thanksgiving Annual Classic Tournament (fundraiser for CCYHA)
 - Teams from Canada and other states compete at multiple ice rinks for championship banners
 - In previous years, championship games at Nationwide Arena
 - 2011-2012 Travel Season was the "Best Travel Year Ever"
 - 2 CSHL League and Tournament Champions
 - 3 BTHL League Champions and 2 BTHL Tournament Champions
 - 2 Silverstick Tournament Champions
 - 4 Other Miscellaneous Championships
 - 1999 Mowat Team Quarterfinalist of Elite Quebec tournament



Blue Jackets Girls' Hockey Program

The only all Girls Hockey Program in Central Ohio.

- 2011-2012 marked the 6th year of the girls program (previously known as the Sting)
- The only all Girls Hockey Program in Central Ohio
- Plays in the Heartland/Midwest Girls Hockey league (MGHL)
- The 2011 – 2012 had the following teams:
 - Travel JV Team (U-14)
 - Travel Varsity Team (U-19)
 - Travel U-12 Elite Team (Tier I)
 - Travel U-14 Elite Team (Tier II)
 - Travel U-16 Elite Team (Tier II)
 - Development U-12 House Team (Squirt Division)



Special Needs Hockey Program

The only one in Central Ohio to offer this type of program.

- 2011-2012 marked the 5th year for the program
- CCYHA partners with the American Special Hockey Association (ASHA) and USA Hockey to provide children and adults who have developmental disabilities with the opportunity to play ice hockey in an environment adapted to each athlete's level of physical and mental ability.
- Team size has continually increased since inception.



Program Challenges & Opportunities

- Challenges inherent with growth
 - Rosters: Player placement at the right level of competition; team parity
 - Coaches: Right coach for the right situation
 - Ice availability as competition for ice time increases
 - High school (JV and Varsity), Figure skating, speed skating, learn to play
 - Open, skate, clinics, private lessons, etc.
 - Parent: maintaining passion and active participation
 - Responsive communications (maintaining a customer service focus)

 - Maintain balance and smart growth
 - Set standards to increase trustees and officer involvement
 - Grow volunteer base
 - Continuous improvement
 - Look for opportunities to continue to ensure that every child **who wants to play hockey, can play hockey** at the appropriate skill level and peer group
