The Irondequoit Soccer Club provides opportunity for school-age children to learn the game of soccer and participate in organized league play. The club is a member of the New York State West Youth Soccer Association ([www.nyswysa.org](http://www.nyswysa.org)) and has served the community for over 40 years.

**Registration is open online from October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2016 and ends January 31<sup>st</sup>, 2017. All registration payments must be received by January 31<sup>st</sup>. No refunds will be given after February 1<sup>st</sup>.**

**Late registrations may be accepted if space is available on or after February 1<sup>st</sup>, with a \$35 late fee.**

#### **Registration fee: includes uniform of jersey & socks:**

U06: \$99, fee also includes size 3 soccer ball

U08-U15: \$140

U19: \$150 U19 players, with birth dates within the matrix, are eligible to play Recreational League soccer if they have **not** played college athletics.

**Registration Confirmation for all new players (check birth certificate if not uploaded during registration) and to check uniform sizes:**

#### **Equipment:**

Parents are expected to provide shin guards, which are mandatory, and water bottles.

Players are encouraged to wear soccer shoes with molded cleats (metal cleats are not allowed), for improved traction.

#### **Special Requests:**

It is ISC policy that children eligible for U06 cannot play up; no exceptions.

Players eligible for U08-U15 age groups that wish to play up must receive approval from the ISC VP of Recreational Soccer League.

All special requests must be submitted by completing the [2017 Recreational Soccer Request Form](#) (in Online Forms tab).

#### **Volunteering:**

Irondequoit Soccer Club is a volunteer organization. Volunteers are needed throughout the season. Parents are required to volunteer for at least 1 position you are available to volunteer for during the soccer season. The expected time commitment for Recreational Soccer is a minimum of 1 ½ hours per season. Parents may sign up for volunteer positions while registering their children.

#### **The Season:**

The season runs from May 1<sup>st</sup> to the end of July.

Parents can expect to be notified after the coaches meeting in April by their child's coach with the soccer season schedule.

All practices and games are typically scheduled for 1 to 1 ½ hours and all players can expect to play half of each game.

#### **Days of play:**

U06 - Coed -Meet on Saturday (8:30 am or 10am) AND Tuesday OR Thursdays

U08 - Coed -Meet on Saturdays (8:30am or 10am) AND Monday OR Wednesdays

U10 – U19 Boys- Meet on Mondays and Wednesdays \*probably plays in **MURSL**

U10 – U19 Girls - Meet on Tuesdays and Thursdays \*probably plays in **MURSL**

\* **MURSL**: whether an age group participates in MURSL depends on the number of registrants. A minimum of 4 teams is required for an age group to remain in Recreational League/Intra-Town, instead of playing in Recreational League/MURSL. Teams playing in MURSL play a minimum of 6 home games and a maximum of 6 away games.
