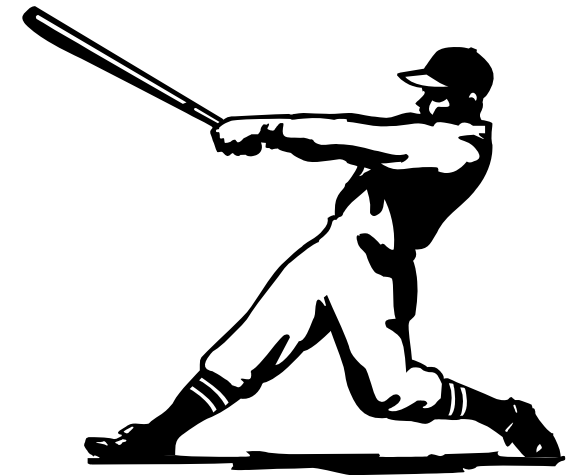

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR

Bill Decker is entering his 20th year as head coach of the Trinity College Baseball Program. During his tenure he has guided Trinity to 18 winning seasons, a 455-196 record (.693%), and 16 playoff appearances. In 2008 his team set an all-time NCAA record finishing 45-1 and captured the 2008 Division III National Championship. Decker's teams have competed in 8 of the last 11 NCAA tournaments and also advanced to play in the College World Series in 2003, 2005 and 2009

Decker has coached 9 players who have signed professional baseball contracts, has schooled 12 All-Americans, and 46 of his players have received All-New England honors. In 2002, Decker became the College's all-time winningest baseball coach. His program is well known throughout New England and is recognized nationally for its contributions and success at the Division III level.

Decker directs many baseball camps and clinics throughout the northeast. His staff consists of Trinity coaches, current and former players, and high area high school coaches.

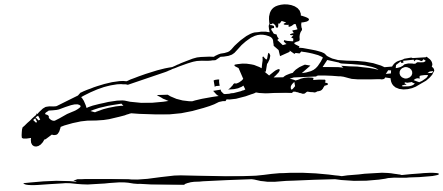
