At Wilton High School, Jeff was All-State, All-New England, and All-American, and his high school was state champions for two consecutive years. At Brown University, Jeff was chosen first team All-Ivy, and in 1979 and 1981 he was the team's most valuable offensive player. He was twice named All-New England as well as All-American. Senior year he was selected to play in the annual North-South Game. His teammates also honored him, selecting him as captain of the lacrosse and soccer teams. Following graduation, Jeff was an Assistant Coach at Yale University for eight years and helped take the Yale lacrosse team to 2 Ivy League Finals and the Final Four. Jeff played professionally for the Boston Militia. Today, Jeff can be seen with a stick in hand as the Director of a boys' sports camp, Camp Cedar, in Casco, Maine. Camp Cedar was featured in Inside Lacrosse magazine. It is a summer site where some of the great coaches and players across the Northeast have come to learn the game and to coach. Jeff and Camp Cedar are also responsible for sending many lacrosse players to top NCAA Division 1 and Division III programs. According to Inside Lacrosse Magazine, The list of DI, II and III standouts stretches out over 30 years. Jeff is responsible for creating his own hometown lacrosse program in Lincoln, MA. He is also a Brown University Hall of Fame member.
