### Game management

3. If the catcher ends the inning as a base runner, it is a good idea to politely ask the coach to have someone else warm up the pitcher to keep the game moving.

4. It is important for umpire partners to meet and talk before the game about who is covering what play in certain situations. It is also important to discuss who will be watching base runners when the ball is in the outfield.

### Positioning

5. With no runners on base, the base umpire should be in \_\_\_\_\_ position.

### Interference

8. A runner from first base is hit by a batted baseball on his way to 2b in front of the second baseman. The umpire rules the runner out and awards the hitter first base.

9. A batter hits a ball past the second baseman and it strikes the umpire behind him. The umpire should signal dead ball and award the hitter first base and any runners forced move up a base.  
True False
10. A batter swings, hits the catcher's mitt and grounds out to the pitcher. Umpire signals catcher's interference and awards the runner first base.  
True False
11. A batter swings and hits the catcher's mitt and hits a ball down the right field line. He reaches first base and gets thrown out at second base. Umpire calls time out and puts the runner back on first base because of the interference.  
True False

### **Passed Ball**

12. Runner on 1<sup>st</sup> base and the ball gets by the catcher. The runner can run as many bases as he can at his own peril to be tagged out.  
True False
13. Runner on 3<sup>rd</sup> base, ball get's past the catcher, he is allowed to try to score.  
True False
14. Runners in 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>, the ball get past the catcher, the runner on 1<sup>st</sup> goes to second base. The catcher tries to throw him out at second and then the runner on third scores. Umpire rules that the runner must return to third base.  
True False

### **Fair Ball/ Foul Ball**

15. Batter hits a ball and it hits behind home plate, it then spins forward, the catcher picks it up in front of home plate and throws to first to get the batter out. Umpire correctly rules fair ball.  
True False
16. The batter hits a ball that rolls up the first base line in foul territory, until it reaches first base and it hits the base. The umpire correctly rules foul ball.  
True False
17. The batter hits a line drive that goes past first base fair, it then hooks and lands on the ground in foul territory in short right field. Umpire correctly rules fair ball.  
True False
18. The batter hits a ball that rolls up the third base line. The ball stops just barely touching the foul line and most of the ball is in foul territory. Umpire correctly rules foul ball.

19. The batter swings at a pitch that hits him in the wrist. Umpire correctly rules foul ball.

20. All three bases and home plate are completely in fair territory?

21. The runner on first base is stealing second. The batter swings and foul tips the ball directly back to the catcher who catches the ball. Umpire correctly rules, ball is alive and the runner can stay on second base.

22. The runner on first base is stealing second. The batter swings and foul tips the ball directly back to the catcher who catches the ball after it hits his chest protector. Umpire correctly rules, ball is alive and the runner can stay on second base.

### **Must slide/Collision**

23. Runner on first base when a batter hits a hard ground ball to the second baseman. The second baseman throws to the shortstop covering 2b. The run is only 3 steps off of first so he peels off toward the outfield. Umpire correctly rules he did not need to slide because he avoided the throw.  
True False

24. Same play as above, but the runner keeps running to second which cause the SS to throw the ball away. Umpire correctly rules both the batter and runner out.  
True                  False
25. Runner is coming around third base to score. The catcher has the plate blocked and the throw is coming from the outfield. The runner attempting to score touches home plate and while doing so, he gently hits the catcher's leg. Umpire correctly rules that this is a collision and the runner is out.  
True                  False
26. Same exact play, except the runner drops his shoulder and hits the catcher knocking him down. The umpire correctly rules the runner out. The base umpire then talks to the plate umpire and they eject the player from the game.

**Miscellaneous Rules**

27. Runner on first is attempting to steal second base. He leaves first base as soon as the ball leaves the pitchers hand. Umpire correctly rules the runner is out for leaving to early.  
True                  False
28. Pitcher throws a ball that bounces and hits the batter in the batters box. Umpire correctly awards the batter first base.  
True                  False
29. An appeal play on a runner that left the base early can be done by tagging the base he left early or by tagging the runner that left early?  
True                  False
30. A runner is trapped in a run down between second and third base. Attempting to get back to second he bumps into the short stop who does not have the ball. He reaches second base safely. The umpire correctly rules, the runner is awarded third base for the "obstruction" at second base.  
True                  False
31. An easy way to remember how to award bases on "obstruction" is: if the defense is trying to get the obstructed runner out, he is awarded the next base. If they obstruct a runner that they are not making a play on, (i.e. ball is in the outfield when the obstruction occurs) the runner is awarded the base the umpire thought he would have reached safely had the obstruction not occurred.

32. Bases loaded and two out. The batter hits a double to left and all the base runner score. The defense appeals that the runner from first base missed second base. The umpire rules the runner out and tells the score keeper that the men on second and third scored.
