



NON-RESIDENT POLICY

Marlboro Youth Soccer (known as MYS) is open to all youth who are residents or attend school in the City of Marlboro as of July 31st of the Soccer Year (a soccer year is defined as the fall and the following spring). A resident is defined as any youth living in Marlboro, any youth who has at least 1 parent living in Marlboro or any youth attending school in the City of Marlboro.

Youth who don't meet these requirements will not be eligible to participate in Marlboro Youth Soccer, unless they qualify under Exception 1 or Exception 2. Even if they qualify under one of the exceptions, Non-Resident players will not be allowed to play if it precludes a Marlboro resident from playing who has registered and paid by the Season Registration Date. Non-Resident players will be notified of the status of their request after the Season Registration Date.

Exception #1

If a player has registered for the up-coming soccer season, moves out of town and stops attending school in the City of Marlboro, they will be eligible to play soccer for the registered Soccer Year (Soccer Year is defined above). After the Soccer Year the player will no longer be eligible to participate in Marlboro Youth Soccer. The player can apply to continue playing in Marlboro by submitting a request to the appropriate Division Director, who will bring it to the Player Placement Sub-committee for a vote.

Exception #2

If a youth in another town has no team for which they can play, they can apply to play in Marlboro for Marlboro Youth Soccer. Requests from Non-Residents should be sent to the appropriate Division Director, who will bring it to the Player Placement Sub-Committee for a vote.

All Non-Resident players that have met the requirements of Marlboro Youth Soccer must still fulfill the waiver requirements of the leagues/towns involved (BAYS, Nashoba, etc.).

Player Placement Sub-Committee

The committee will consist of the President, Vice-President, Development Director and Division Director unless there is deemed to be a conflict of interest. The group will vote on the requests using a simple majority vote.

Any appeals, in writing, may be brought before the Board of Directors.
