The Rookie League

The Home Run Card

The League continues its ***Field Improvement Fund*** to support the refurbishment of fields and equipment. ***The Home Run Card*** is a major fund-raiser for this Fund. Each player will purchase two \$5.00 Cards along with the \$70 registration fee. The player may sell these valuable discount cards and keep the proceeds of the sale. This provides each player the opportunity to participate in the development of facilities which all will enjoy.

Rookie League Program: How it works

The Rookie League Program is generally for 5 and 6 year old players. This division uses a special baseball designed not to cause injury upon contact. The ball is hit off a rubber tee. Players rotate defensive positions after every batter. The inning is over after everyone has batted. Players are assigned to teams with consideration given to balance of ages, special request by the players and school district. Siblings will be assigned to the same teams. There will be an approximate 14 game schedule played preceded by two weeks of practices beginning in early April. The season ends at the end of the school year. Games are played twice a week. Weekday games start promptly at 6:00 p.m. and Saturday games at 9:30a.m, 11:45am or 2:00p.m. Rain dates will vary this schedule. Rotary, Hopewell, High Street and Eastbury Fields will be used. A special ***Rookie Weekend*** will be held in early June at Ross Field. Notification of team assignments will occur in late March or early April.

A Little League player's age is defined by that player's age on **April 30, 2010**

Volunteers Needed

Glastonbury Little League is a community activity. It is operated totally by the efforts of volunteers, donations from sponsors and registration fees.
