***WESTON GARDEN CLUB'S 1st ANNUAL GARDEN TOUR SATURDAY, JUNE 14th**

Weston Garden Club's First Annual Garden Tour is scheduled for Saturday, June 14th. The tour includes six private gardens in town including historic landmarks and working farms.

When Weston was incorporated in 1787, it was an agricultural community. Today, Weston carries on the agrarian tradition. Lachat Farm is preparing community gardens for the first time and farm stands have popped up around town. On June 14th, the public will get a chance to see some of Weston's most exquisite gardens. Some of the gardens included in **Weston Garden Club's First Annual Garden Tour** have never been open to the public before.

Club presidents, **Pat Glass** and **Karin Feingold**, are delighted that the owners have graciously agreed to open their gates for the public to see these very special gardens. "We have so many exciting things going on in Weston. We have seen local interest in gardening increase exponentially over the past few years," say **Feingold**, who holds the **Master Gardener** designation from the **American Horticultural Society**,

Michelle Fracasso, owner of Well's Hill Farm, is excited that Fairfield County has embraced the local food movement. Her hope is that people will see their small family farm and feel inspired to duplicate what they do on a smaller scale. "We are so honored to be included on the **First Annual Weston Garden Tour**. I love having children visit and harvest vegetables for the first time. When I see them munch on our veggies with gusto, I know that all the hard work is worthwhile."

TOUR DETAILS

Hours for the **Weston Garden Club's First Annual Garden Tour** are from 11:00 am to 3:00 pm on Saturday, June 14th. The first stop is at the home of Shirley and Fred Schneider at 104 Norfield Road. Check in there, pick up your ticket and map, and enjoy a wonderful day of strolling through some spectacular settings. Tickets may be purchased ahead of time at westongardenclub.com or on the day of the event. The day of the tour, tickets are \$25; if you purchase online by June 13, tickets are \$20. Children under 12 are free.

THE GARDENS

SCHNEIDER'S GARDEN

Fred and Shirley Schneider moved to Weston from England in 1981 and created their garden from virgin, neglected farmland. Their lovely English-influenced garden features many mature plantings and trees including boxwoods, rhododendrons, azaleas, hollies, styrax japonica, dogwoods and Japanese red maples. Their flower gardens include peonies, irises, roses, phlox, hydrangeas and several varieties of spirea. They also have a fenced vegetable garden with raised beds. Shirley has been involved with **Weston Garden Club** since 1995 and was the club's president from 2007 to 2009. Both she and Fred have been avid supporters of many Weston civic and charitable activities.

PINK HOUSE

Dating from 1792, the historic landmark Pink House on Good Hill Road has been lovingly restored and updated over 25 years by its current owners. The greenhouse with hand painted interior and raised bed vegetable garden are a gardeners delight. Fountains, frogs, and dog statues accent the property as well as numerous old specimen trees. A koi pond adds interest to the backyard pool. It is as colorful as the flowers and vegetables in the gardens.

OLD REVSON ESTATE

The owners of the old Revson estate had a dream of creating a self-sustaining farm on their property and they have succeeded. They try to grow as many foods as they can and store a fair amount for the winter. The farm includes organic fruits and vegetables, an abundance of cutting flowers, chickens and honeybees. They concentrate on vegetables they know their kids will eat and have learned that they can never grow too many tomatoes. They care for their gardens with loving assistance from Aventine Gardens who the owners consider visionaries, first as artists and second as gardeners.

DIRT ROAD FARM

The Dirt Road Farm Chef's Garden, as well as the property's cutting and herb gardens, are productive "working" gardens first—a feast for the eyes occasionally.

Phoebe Cole-Smith is a private farm-to-table chef. She and her husband Mike keep laying chickens and bees, produce maple syrup, and grow organic food on their property to use in Phoebe's cooking and preservation projects.

Permaculture products include Concord grapes, asparagus, horseradish, rhubarb, Jerusalem artichokes, and a number of fruit- and nut-bearing trees. Every year, the vegetable garden is brimming with any or all of the following: fava, flageolet and scarlet runner beans, haricots verts, hard-neck garlic, Trombetta di Albenga zucchini, 'Red Giant' mustard, collard greens, cucumbers, 'Bright Lights' Swiss chard, multi-colored heirloom 'Carnival' carrots, 'Chioggia' beets, and many varieties of peppers, tomatoes, lettuces, and winter squash. Phoebe and Mike also grow edible flowers to use in her cooking, such as sunflowers, marigolds, daylilies, nasturtiums, violets, Johnny-jump-ups, calendula, and lavender. All the annual and perennial flowers on the property are grown with the intention of attracting pollinators. Reseeding annuals are encouraged to weave through the gardens, creating a pleasingly haphazard tapestry of color, shape, and scent.

STONYBROOK

The history of Stonybrook makes this garden a very special place. Alice De Lamar, a wealthy gold mine heiress, built Stonybrook as a summer residence and artists' colony in the early 1930s. At one time, she employed over 30 people to care for the property, which ran along Newtown Turnpike from the former Three Bears Inn to Cobb's Mill. Alice played host to many famous and not so famous actors, artists, musicians and dancers. Her Olympic-size pool was built with a tunnel coming from the house for Alice's daily swims. After her death in 1983, the remaining 11.5 acres was maintained with a similar aesthetic, that of an English garden, and has had only two other owners.

WELLS HILL FARM

Wells Hill Farm strives to model sustainability and the best organic growing practices for small family farms. Companion herbs and flowers are integrated throughout their production gardens. They grow produce intensively on one third of an acre and use their remaining thirteen acres of pastures and woodlands for rotating two mobile chicken coops, one goat/sheep house, and rabbits hutches—all of which add to their rich compost, control pests, and keep weeding around the property to a minimum. The property also features a newly established fruit and nut orchard. They do all farming by hand and do not till the soil. Wells Hill Farm sells to restaurants in Fairfield County and New York City and holds periodic farming classes for children and adults. Daisy and Ranger, the owner's Maremma livestock guardian dogs, protect the animals and plantings from wildlife predators.
