

Woodstown Lacrosse Registration Policy

During the month of August the board will set a “target” number of teams for the coming season. This target will be based on:

- The number of returning players expected at each age group.
- The number of new players expected at each age group.
- The number of coaches who have expressed a commitment to coach.
- A target team size for full sided games of 20 players – 14 min and 20 max
- A target team size for small sided games of 16 players – 12 min and 16 max

Registration dates will be set in August. All registration will be done online via www.woodstownlacrosse.com

Online registration will be opened from November 1st until January 30th. Returning players will be notified via e-mail.

A player is not registered until registration is complete online (include US Lacrosse registration), AND payment is received.

Registration will be capped using the “target” number of teams. Each team will be limited to a maximum of 20 players for full sided games and 16 for small sided games. The available slots will be filled in the following sequence:

1. Returning players who are registered online and paid in full before January 1st will be given priority over newly registered players. – This is because they have already made a substantial investment in equipment.
2. Any returning player registered online and paid in full on or after January 1st, as well as all New players that are registered online and paid in full, will be considered the same and given second priority. The order of priority within this group will be determined by the date the registration is PAID IN FULL (if paid online, the paid in full date is registered with the system; if check is mailed then it is the date by which the check is received by Woodstown Lacrosse).
3. If all the “Target” slots are filled at a given age level, the next paid player to register will be put on a waiting list. Payment checks for waiting list players will not be cashed until the player is put on a team, however a check must be in the club’s possession to place a player on the list.
4. If any registered players drop out of the program, their spot will be filled by the first person in line on the waiting list.
5. If enough players join the waiting list to form a new team, **and** the club is able to find a qualified coach to teach said team, the club will add an additional team.
6. Players can be taken from the “Target” teams to build a new team as long as no teams are left with less than 14 players for full sided teams, and 12 players for small sided teams.
7. This process will be used only to determine which registrants are accepted into the program. – Try-outs amongst the accepted players could be used to place players on teams.
