

2012 High School Season

1. Player Registration

- All players must be registered and cleared with the Arizona Lacrosse League (ALL) to participate in league games.
- Players that have been cleared with the league will appear online under the team's roster.
- A team that is found participating with an unregistered player will face sanctions listed below under the "Rosters" topic.
- No 12th graders are allowed to play in JV games.
- All 8th grade players that are "playing up" must register for the High School Division, pay the league fee and have a letter of recommendation & acceptance on file with the league (see below).

2. Rosters

- The teams' official ALL Team Roster is required to be placed in the teams' scorebook. **The location is on the inside of the front cover.**
- To print your official roster you go to the league website, select your team and then go to Roster. From that screen go to the top right and select "Show Printable Version", then print.
- Sanctions
 - i. Level 1 If a team is found to have an unregistered player participate in a game then the game will be forfeited.

3. 8th Grade Players – Playing JV

- The 8th Grade players will be allowed to participate with their future High School team with these guidelines:
 - i. The 8th grade players must practice with their respective JHS team until after their respective sanctioning league finishes their season. They are not allowed to practice or play with High School players until the end of the season.
 - ii. The JHS coach must write a letter of recommendation and the HS must write a letter of acceptance. The preferred method of communication is an email chain that is sent to the ALL at Info@arizonalacrosseleague.com.
 - iii. The JHS coach should send an email to the respective HS coach that serves as the letter of recommendation. The HS coach should reply to the JHS coach and cc: the league (lnfo@arizonalacrosseleague.com) to get the letter on file. Only 8th graders with the proper documentation will be cleared to the roster
 - iv. The player will need to re-register with the A.L.L. for the High School team and pay the league fee for the High School Division.

4. Officials Payment

- The officials will be paid \$75 each for a regulation game.
- The Home Team will pay the Referee
- The Visiting Team will pay the Umpire
- In the event of only one official, the official will earn \$112.50 and each team will pay \$56.25.

5. Game Scores & Statistics

- The Home Team is responsible placing the game score online within 24 hours of the game.
- The team administrator or coach must enter the player statistics within 48 hours of the game. The team is required to list all games played (GP) for every player.
- Sanctions for failure to report scores or player statistics
 - i. Level I 3 minute non-releasable penalty at the start of next scheduled game.
 - ii. Level II Repeated violations will result in a game forfeiture.

6. Health and Safety Sheet

• The attached Health & Safety Sheet is required to be completed and placed in your scorebook. The location is on the inside of the back cover.

7. Uniforms

- The home team is responsible for avoiding a color conflict between the teams.
- If you are not sure of your opponents color then contact them in advance.
- It is acceptable to wear an offsetting color pinnie to avoid a color conflict.

8. Schedule – Game Changes

- The home team must complete the 2012 High School Game Change Request Form and submit to Info@ArizonaLacrosseLeague.com
- Forms must be submitted no later than 48 hours in advance of the new start time or the original game time, whichever is sooner.
- Game change approvals are subject to availability of officials.

9. Schedule – Rainouts

• In the event of a rainout the home team is responsible for contacting the league at Info@arizonalacrosseleague.com and reach the assigned officials. This information is posted in Arbiter 48 hours in advance of the game start time.

11. Sportsmanship

- It is unfortunate but the league is currently reviewing multiple cases of unsportsmanlike behavior from both Coaches and Players. This notice is going out to reinforce the standards that we expect from the Coaches and inform all members that there is zero tolerance for unsportsmanlike behavior in league events.
- Head Coaches Coaches should hold themselves to the highest standards since they represent their organization and are a model for the boys. The Coaches must assist the officials in keeping a game under control, on the field and ensuring that spectators exhibit good behavior. The Head Coach is responsible for all persons connected to their team or institution. Coaching the game of lacrosse to young boys is an honor and privilege that carries with it the moral responsibility to contribute to the healthy character development of these young athletes.
- Let's keep things in perspective –

"Sportsmanship holds the strongest values in sports. It holds more value than strength, endurance or any other physical attribute that comes with sports. Sportsmanship is having the mental power to stay composed in a situation that could lead to a conflict. Sportsmanship is being able to endure a loss and not retaliate against the other team or act out in a way that would cause shame to your team. Sportsmanship is being able to uphold your integrity as an athlete and not resort to ways that would be considered cheating. Holding sportsmanship above all other values that come with sports is important and key to maintaining a respectable image in the world of sports."
