



CHICAGO EDGE SC
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I, _____, am being engaged by the Chicago Edge SC, a not-for-profit youth soccer organization, to work as a referee in their youth soccer program. I have already completed a certification course offered by the United States Soccer Federation (USSF), and understand the role of serving as a youth referee. I understand that a parent or guardian must supervise 12 and 13 year old referees during the games.

Chicago Edge SC participates with the Illinois Women's Soccer League and the Northern Illinois Soccer League offering 10 soccer games/travel team in the fall and 8 soccer games/travel team in the spring. Games are played on weekends. I may be assigned to referee a minimum of 1 game to a maximum of 4 games on game days during each season. Game lengths run between 60 minutes and up to 80 minutes depending on the player's age group. Occasionally, I may be assigned to referee a weeknight "make-up" game - such an assignment would not exceed one game per night. Dependent on my level of USSF certification, I will be assigned as a center referee to games in which I will be at least 3 years older than the players or as a linesman to games where I am at least as old as the players. My total assignments will not exceed ten hours per week nor will any assignment occur after 9:00PM.

I am requesting a work permit, which is required by the Illinois Department of Labor (820 ILCS 205), to allow me to work as a youth referee for Chicago Edge. I am submitting this letter, along with a copy of my birth certificate, and social security card to my school to process the request for the permit.
