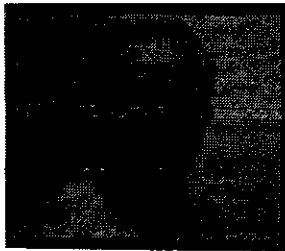
EDITORIAL

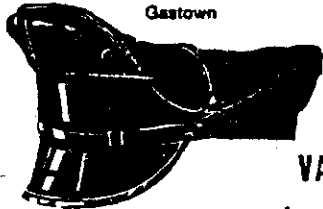
