Player/Roster Assignment Procedure

**APPROVED
March 4, 2013**

1.0 PURPOSE:

This document describes the manner in which the Riverside-Bradford Baseball League (RB) will assign players to teams based on their individual ages and skill levels.

2.0 PROCEDURE:

2.1 Non-Competitive Divisions (Instructional, Minor, Major/Minor)

- 2.1.1 The Player Agent and his/her tasked committee will, to the best of their ability, honor all requests of parents/guardians to allow participants (players) to play with specified participants or coaches in their division.
- 2.1.2 Returning and/or divisional players may remain with their existing team members.
- 2.1.3 New divisional players will be assigned to a team relative to the school and neighborhood composition of that team.

2.2 Competitive Divisions (Single A, Double A, Triple A, RB13-14)

- 2.2.1 The Player Agent and his/her tasked committee will, to the best of their ability, honor all requests of parents/guardians to allow participants (players) to play with specified participants and/or coaches within the scope of achieving team parity in these divisions.
- 2.2.2 Evaluations are held to assess and rank the basic baseball skills of returning players and of players achieving the proper age and/or skill criteria of these divisions.
- 2.2.3 Returning divisional players may remain with their existing team members.
- 2.2.4 Based on evaluation scoring, players will be placed on teams by the Player Agent committee with the goal of creating a balanced division.

2.3 Major A Division

- 2.3.1 The Player Agent and his/her tasked committee will, to the best of their ability, honor all requests of parents/guardians to allow participants (players) to play with specified participants and/or coaches within the scope of achieving team parity in this division.
- 2.3.2 The Player Agent committee will evaluate all returning divisional players to determine team strength.
- 2.3.3 Evaluations are held to assess and rank the basic baseball skills of returning players and of players achieving the proper age (10-12 yrs old) and skill criteria of this division.
- 2.3.4 The Player Agent committee will compile an allotted pool of players based on evaluation scoring and assessments of which players will be eligible for this division.
- 2.3.5 The Player Agent will convey all team rosters to the same number of players held by the team with the highest number of returning players. Through the process of a



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draft selection of players from this allotted pool of players the RB Board-approved Major A coaches will choose players by descending age (12-10 yrs old) in a single draft round order as determined by the Player Agent in their appraisal of achieving team parity in this division.

- 2.3.6 In the event the number of teams in the division changes from a prior year, each coach may retain a predetermined number of players approved by the player agent.
- 2.3.7 Returning divisional players may remain with their existing team members unless otherwise requested.
