SPRING 2014 SEASON RESULTS

It wasn't that long ago that our team's division placements and results were always tempered with "not bad for a small town." But no longer. Due in large part to our decision to adopt an Academy system (methodical curriculum, balanced teams up to U11) we are now fielding robust rosters at every age group and results that are the envy of our larger neighbors.

This spring we fielded four teams in the A Division: U11 Girls (our first Junior Academy team in 2011), U12 Boys (our first U9 Academy team in 2010) and the U13 Boys and Girls (our first U10 Academy teams in 2010).

Both the U14 Girls and Boys finished near the top of the B Division. The U12 Girls finished in first place in the B2 Division and our U11 Girls and Boys are top of the C Division.

Nobody is talking about the size of Weston now!

PLAYERS OF THE FUTURE

As you know, we don't keep score or have a league standing in our Junior Academy and Academy programs (U8-U10). The only focus at this age group is individual player development. But with registration numbers at an all time high, we want to give a special mention to the children involved in these programs. SELECT TEAMS Girls and Boys U9-U10

As the standard of soccer has increased over recent years, so has the demand. Our Select Program, now in its third year, is designed to "feed" our best U9 and U10 players with an extra practice day (ages combined, sexes separate).

This spring, both Girls and Boys teams played in the LaGrange cup, a NY Tournament in LaGrangeville, on June 14 at the U10 age group. All in all, it was a huge success. The Select Girls left with 1 win, 2 ties, and 1 loss. The Select Boys left with 2 wins, 1 tie and 1 loss.

EXPANDING THE ELITE PROGRAM Boys U12-U14

This spring, Kevin Fitzsimmons (Soccer Edge) began a Boys Elite Program, aimed at promoting the skills of the 16 top players in the three years leading up to High School. Selection is made by the coaching staff.

The first Elite Team was made up of four U12 players, five U13 players and eight U14 players. They practiced together once a week and played in a nationally ranked college showcase tournament in Needham MA at the U14 level. The Weston Elite team did a fantastic job as they competed against three nationally ranked premier teams from outside our state and left with a 1-0-2 record, an impressive feat especially given the age disparity (up to three years) for our youngest players.

NEXT FALL: Building on that success, Kevin is now expanding the program. Next fall there will be a two-day tryout process, which will take place the first week of the fall season. The selected players will practice twice per week (Mondays and Thursdays) and attend an end of season tournament in Virginia during November.

GIRLS SHOOTING CLINIC

In the fall, Gustavo will be offering a weekly "shooting clinic" for his Girls teams. Details to be announced shortly.

- Recreation programs from Tots through Kindergarten will kick off on Saturday September
 6 and our First Grade Junior Academy players will have their first practice on Tuesday
 September 2.

STRONG FALL 2014 REGISTRATION NUMBERS

The numbers are in.

Since we live in a relatively small town, enrollment numbers are always a concern. So we're very happy to report robust numbers for the coming fall season. Coupled with some impressive results on the field, we see this uptick in numbers as a clear validation of the program.

We currently have 75 players registered for Boys U11-U14 Travel and 76 players registered for Girls U11-U14 Travel. Our Academy Teams (U9/U10) have 37 boys registered and 37 girls registered. Registration is still open for our Rec players.
