14. 34 specific rules
 - Short field, 6v6 including goalies. No offsides rules (ie. All players are midfielders)
 - Absolutely no body checking at 34.
 - Penalties will be served but teams will not go man down in 34.
 - No long sticks at 34.
 - Face off is 1v1. 2 players from each team will remain at GLE until possession is called or the ball passes GLE.
 - 2 passes must be attempted each possession, monitored by the referee and coaches.
 - No time limit on individual players holding the ball.
 - Substitutions on dead balls.
15. K2 specific rules
 - The purpose of the K2 age group is instruction and fun.
 - Score will be kept
 - Goals are 4' x 4' with a regulation crease.
 - Players will wear full lacrosse gear.
 - Referees are not used. One coach from each team will be on the field controlling the play of the game.
 - When a ground ball situation is not likely to be resolved, coaches should stop play and award the ball according to Alternate Possession. Visitors shall receive the first alternate possession.
 - Technical fouls should be corrected on the field. If the penalized team had possession of the ball, it will be awarded to the other team at midfield or at the sideline.
 - Restarts should be placed at the sideline, midfield, or endline.
 - Short field, 4v4 without goalies. No offsides rules (ie. All players are midfielders)
 - Absolutely no body checking at K2.
 - Penalties will not be served and teams will not go man down in K2 but players will leave the field and be substituted for in the event of a personal foul.
 - No long sticks at K2.
 - No faceoffs. Alternating possession for each half.
 - All players on defense will begin at GLE.
 - All players on offense will begin on their defensive side of the midline.
 - 2 passes must be attempted each possession, monitored by the referee and coaches.
 - No time limit on individual players holding the ball.
 - Substitutions on dead balls.
