The Connecticut RiverHawks understand that as parents we want the best for our children and that hockey is an emotional sport. As parents, we must be keenly aware of what we teach our children through **our** behavior as they play the game of hockey.

The CT RiverHawks expect the following Code of Conduct will be followed by the parents of all of our players and the parents will enforce this code with their guests as well (grandparents, uncles, aunts, etc.)

1. I will allow the coaches to coach. If I have an issue with the coach, I agree to abide by the “48 hour” rule and address the coach at least 48 hours after the incident and in private.
2. I will allow the officials to officiate and treat them with respect. I will not berate or exhibit demeaning behavior to any referee or hockey official.
3. I will allow the children to play the game of hockey. I will not yell at my child or another child while they are playing a game.
4. I understand that the Code of Conduct includes the Association’s Statement of Purpose and Philosophy and policies on Fighting, Excessive Penalties, Commitment, Behavior and Discipline and Dressing Arrangements for Co-Ed teams. Violations of this Code of Conduct can result in disciplinary action up to and including removal from the Association. 5. I understand that the CT RiverHawks Board of Directors, at the October 2, 2006 meeting, unanimously decided to implement a policy that any parent who refuses to sign the Parent Code of Conduct will not be allowed to attend any Connecticut RiverHawks games. Furthermore, refusal abide by the above forementioned policy will lead to the suspension of play for your child.
