Communications:

In games where no athletic trainer is provided, the team coach will make the decision to call for emergency assistance in the case of a medical emergency. The coach will find a Board Member in attendance who will place the call. In the event that a board member cannot be located quickly, the coach will place the call.

Chain of Command (Rank):

1. President
2. Vice President
3. Secretary
4. Coaches Rep
5. GBYLA Rep
6. Head Coach of playing team

Locate Parents:

Using the Chain of Command (Rank), locate the player's parent(s). Escort parent to the ambulance and remain with parent and player until both have left the field.

Staff Responsibilities

Duty	Person responsible
Call EMS	Ranking person in attendance
Get AED (small concessions)	Ranking person in attendance or other person designated by ranking person
Meet EMS/Unlock Gate	Ranking person in attendance or other person designated by ranking person
Ride with athlete if no parent present	Ranking person in attendance or other person designated by ranking person
Remain with other players	Assistant coach

AED is located in hallway beneath the press box near the bathrooms

Severe Weather Terms

1. Severe Weather Watch – Defined as a forecast issued well in advance of a severe weather event to alert the public of the possibility of a particular hazard, such as tornadoes, thunderstorms, and flash floods.
2. Severe Weather Warning – Defined as a forecast issued when severe weather has developed, is already occurring, or is detected on radar. Warnings state a particular hazard or imminent danger, such as tornadoes, thunderstorms, and flash floods.

Tornado

1. When a Tornado Watch is issued:
 - a. Stay tuned to local news and weather.
 - b. Be alert to any changing weather conditions.
2. When a Tornado Warning is issued
 - a. Go to “Dawg House” for shelter. Bathrooms at the Dawg House will be opened for shelter purposes.
 - b. Go beneath Press Box for shelter. Small concession stand under Press Box will be opened for shelter.
 - c. DO NOT return to vehicles.
 - d. Remain in shelter until “All Clear” is given.

Fire Plan

1. Spectators should exit the stands and leave the field through the gates to the parking lot and remain there.
2. All players should be taken by the coach to the parking lot between the football field and the baseball field. Coaches MUST remain with the players and maintain accountability for ALL players.
