

Spring 2010 Traveling Eagles FAQ

Pay-n-Play Option

Q: What happens if I don't register online for the Pay-N-Play option by December 4, 2009?

A: You will be considered part of the fundraising team and you are required to participate in ALL fundraising activities defined by the Spring 2010 Fundraising Committee.

Q: What are the Pay-N-Play costs for each age group and payment due dates?

A: See table below for the registration and total spring fees. A payment schedule for the Spring Fee is available and shown below for those that would rather pay their Spring Fee in installments.

Other costs: Uniforms costs TBD in December and City fee of \$10 for residents and \$20 for non-residents.

Q: If I chose the Pay-N-Play Option, can I still fundraise or generate sponsorships individually or in a small group?

A: Yes. If one chooses the Pay-N-Play Option no later than December 4, then they must adhere to the Pay-N-Play payment schedule for the spring fee. Payments can be made directly by each member or through credits by sponsorships/fundraising or a combination of the two. Again, it is important that each Pay-N-Play participant adheres to their payment schedule. Keep in mind that all fundraisers done in the name of NAYB/Traveling Eagles must be approved by the NAYB Executive Board. Also, Pay-N-Play payments and/or sponsor credits will be accepted early. For example, one could pay their entire total Pay-N-Play fees in a lump sum by December 15.

Q: Is there a grace period beyond a Pay-n-Play due date?

A: Yes. The NAYB Board has approved a 15- day grace period beyond the Pay-n-Play due dates. For example, one can pay the December 15 payment by Dec 30 and still not be considered late.

Q: What are the consequences for players that have accounts that are overdue?

A: If payment is not received before the end of the Pay-n-Play 15-day grace period then the Board will consider the player's account delinquent and will take appropriate action which may include suspending the player from practice or game participation until his account is no longer delinquent. For repeated violation of the payment due dates and non-payment, the Board reserves the right to remove a player from his team's roster.

Fundraising Option

Q: Do all fundraisers done in the name of NAYB or the Traveling Eagles have to be approved by the NAYB Executive Board?

A: yes.

Q: Do members that elect the fundraising option have to pay the Registration Fee and City Fee?

A: Yes, those that elect the fundraising option must pay the \$175 Registration Fee and the City Fee (\$10 in-area and \$20 out-of-area). Also, fundraisers are required to pay for mandatory uniform items. The only fee not required by those that choose the fundraising option is the Spring Fee shown in the table above.

Q: Is NAYB a non-profit organization?

A: Yes. Donations made by corporations and individuals to NAYB are typically considered charitable donations (as defined by the IRS). However, each corporation and individual needs to seek professional tax advice before they contribute to NAYB.

Q: How much money will the Fundraising Committee have to raise?

A: Prior to the Parents Meeting on Dec 17, the board will determine the required amount to be raised by the Spring 2010 fundraising participants. The amount to be raised per player by the fundraising team will equal the average spring fee to be paid by the Pay-n-Play participants.

Q: Who is on the Fundraising Committee?

A: The Fundraising Committee will be lead by at least three 'fundraising' participants from each age group and monitored by the NAYB Executive Board. If an age group has less than three members electing the fundraising option, then by default they are members of the fundraising committee. Mike Wells has been voted by the Board to be the Spring 2010 Fundraising Committee Chairman.

Q: What if the Fundraising Committee doesn't generate enough funds to cover their required fundraising goal?

A: If by February 28, 2010, the fundraising goal has not been met, then the amount not covered by fundraising will be split up equally over all fundraising participants. Payment by each fundraiser to cover the shortage will be due no later than March 15, 2010.

City Fee

Q: What is the City Fee, how much is it, and when is it due?

A: The City of Niceville has required NAYB to collect a facility usage fee from all players for the spring 2010 season. The fee for Niceville residents is \$10. The fee for non-residents, including Bluewater and Eglin, is \$20. Please make a **separate** check payable to the "City of Niceville" by 1/31/2010 and give it to your team representative.

Uniforms

Q: How much will uniforms cost this year? The Board is currently evaluating proposals from several vendors. It is estimated that uniforms will cost between \$115 and \$130 per player this season depending on size. More info will be available soon.

Q: Will there be a deposit due for uniforms?

A: Yes, there will be a deposit due for uniforms when placing the order. Historically, the deposit has been 50% of the total uniform order. The remaining balance will be due when the uniforms are ready to be distributed to the teams in late January or early February. More info will be available soon.

Q: Are sample uniforms going to be available to try on?

A: We are hoping AAU will agree to have players work directly with AAU to get their uniforms fitted properly – the first try.

Q: What are the mandatory uniform items that must be purchased this season?

A: Two shirts, two pants, and one hat.
