**Fees:** *Tackle Football:* \$65 non-refundable deposit due at registration, balance of \$300 due at equipment pickup. **Fees after May 31<sup>st</sup> \$405.00.**  
*Flag Football:* \$95 due at registration. **Fees after May 31<sup>st</sup> \$125.00**  
*Cheerleading:* \$65 non-refundable deposit due at registration, balance of \$120 due at uniform pickup. **Fees after May 31<sup>st</sup> \$215.00**

## Tackle Football Information

The youth tackle football program is open to all boys and girls in grades 2 through 8. No boy/girl may be allowed to participate if he/she reaches the age of 15 prior to **September 1<sup>st</sup> 2011** or has progressed beyond eighth grade during the program year. Players will be weighed at equipment hand-out and that weight, along with the age as of September 1<sup>st</sup>, will be used to help determine what level the player will be assigned to. The VHCYAA President and Football Commissioner will make the final determination of level players are assigned to.

## Flag Football Information

The youth flag football program is open to all boys and girls ages 5 to 7. No boy/girl will be allowed to participate if he/she reaches the age of 8 prior to **September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2011** or has progressed beyond 1<sup>st</sup> grade during the program year.

## Cheerleading Information:

The cheerleading program is open to all girls in grades K through 8. No girl may be allowed to participate if she reaches the age of 15 prior to **September 1<sup>st</sup> 2011** or has progressed beyond eighth grade during the program year.
