# 2010 BJ season is underway

The 2010 Ban Johnson League season is underway and, no, the rainy season has not hit yet.

The same 11 teams are back for the 2010 season.

What does 2010 portend for the 11 Ban Johnson League teams?

We know that the MSBL Royals had a perfect run through the 2009 tournament and captured the league title by beating UMB Bank 3-0 in the championship series.

The Royals were 7-0 in tourney play and the championship was their second in the last four years. Can they make it three out of five? Only time can tell. Stay tuned.

Here is a look at the season based on information supplied by the teams. The teams are listed based on last year's championship series and then by place in the final standings.

So what does 2010 look like?

#### **MSBL Royals**

Mike Evans is in his second season leading the Royals. And winning the title in the first-year does not give him much room for improvement.

"I look forward to another successful season from our team," he said. "We are going to be a younger club this season, but I expect the returnees to build off the experience from last summer. We have guys who know how to play the game and I expect them to work hard and continuously get better throughout the summer."

Evans pointed to several players to watch, including right-handed pitcher Alex Dunn from Missouri State, right-handed pitcher Logan Forbis from Emporia State, first baseman Jarid Renzelman from Mid-America Nazarene, shortstop/right-handed pitcher Stephen Maurin from University of St. Mary, catcher John Oxley from Emporia State and utility player Hunter Johnson from KCKCC.

#### **UMB Bank**

**Adam Clay** is the second-year coach for UMB Bank.

"This season our goal is to win the BJ Championship and to avoid another second place finish like last year," Clay said. "We bring back a nucleus of last year's team and some newcomers that will definitely get us back to the championship."

The players to watch for UMB include outfielder Cameron Bentley, who has signed with Arkansas-Little Rock for next season; outfielder-pitcher Joe Kassanavoid from Park College; outfielder Bubba Dotson from Neosho County; first baseman Nick Doughty from Neosho County; catcher-third baseman Kyle Clifton from Crowder Community College; pitcher Tommy Coovert from St. Louis University; outfielder Kevin Star from Iowa Western CC; pitcher Zack DeValle from Park University and first baseman Ryan Rush from Park University.

# A quick glance at the 2010 Ban Johnson League season

Here are some key facts about the 2009 season:

- \* There are 11 teams in the league with no divisions.
- \* Each team will play the other teams three times for a total of 30 games per team in the regular season.
- \* There will be a tournament to decide the league champion at the end of the season.
- \* All 11 teams will be in the tournament and will be seeded by their record in the regular season. The first round of games will just be one game. The quarterfinals and semifinals are best two-of-three with the championship decided by a best three-of-five series.
- \* The All-Star Game hosted by the Kansas City Royals will be played at Kauffman Staidum.

The game will played following the 1:10 p.m. Royals vs. Oakland July 18 game.

#### **BJ Raiders**

Mike Herr is starting his third year as the Raiders manager.

"I'm excited about the season," he said. "We fell short of our ultimate goal last year of a league championship and we are anxious to get another shot at it."

The returning core players include outfielder **Freddie Adamson** from William Jewell; infielder **Taylor Sibala** from Pittsburg State; catcher **Pat McCoy** from Avila; left-handed pitcher **Tyler Sullivant** from Fort Scott CC; and right-handed pitcher **Collin Warren** from William Jewell.

"We picked up a few guys from William Jewell that will help solidify our pitching staff and another two guys from Jewell that will help us in the infield and outfield," he said. "We also have some guys from Maple Woods, Hutchinson and Northwest Missouri and a few guys out of local high schools."

#### **NKC Apartments**

John Strobl is in his seventh year as the manager.

"NKC lost quite a few players from last year's team that finished second in the regular season," GM **David Gershon** said. "Relying on several key veterans, we feel we have assembled a very good team for 2010. We have added depth and speed in the outfield."

The leading pitcher returning is **Shay Colburn** from Northeastern Oklahoma College along with veterans **Brandon Verhulst** from KCKCC, **Brett Slobodzian** from Benedictine, **Colin Letcher** from Maple Woods and Dallas Owens from Oklahoma Panhandle. New pitchers include **Dylen Jensen** from Swarthmore College, **Jason Borchardt** from Central Missouri, **Daniel O'Brien** from Missouri Valley, **Taylor Wissel** from NW Missouri and **Jarrod Bennett** and **Derek Surdez** from Benedictine.

Key position players returning include third baseman Andrew Kuhn from Texas College, third baseman/DH David Wade from Washburn and shortstop TJ Brewer from Northeastern Oklahoma.

New to catcher are **Nick Lichtenberger** from Rockhurst and **Patrick Richards** from Benedictine. Lichtenberger may also do some pitching.

Other players that are expect to contribute include second baseman/outfielder **Ryan Lengyel** from Benedictine, first baseman/DH **Sam Carr** from Central Christian College, outfielder/pitcher **Luke Zeller** from Pittsburg State, outfielder/catcher **Nick Bamber** from Fort Scott CC, first baseman **Kyle Williams** from Crowder CC; utility player **Zack Gebhardt** from Central Missouri and outfielder/pitcher **Landon Fall** from Barton County CC.

#### Seaboard

**Ryan Tousley** is in his second year as manager for the team.

In 2009, the franchise had its best year and its first winning season.

The top players include outfielder **Chad Shannon**, who has signed at JCCC, **Ben Millard** from Missouri Southern, right-hander pitchers **Jeff Soptic** and **Vince Spilker**. Soptic was picked by the Royals in last year's first-year player draft and Spilker by Tampa Bay.

#### **Milgram Mustangs**

**Don Motley** is back for his 43rd year as either the coach or manager for Milgram.

He has a number of returning players back in the fold

for the Mustangs, including Brandon Pearl, Steafaan Jefferson, Ryan Bontrager, Clarke O'Dowd, Steve Scheelk, Scarlett Logan, Shelton Miles and Josh White

Motley is looking for help from newcomers including David Collins, Curtiss Bunch, Gilberto Pena and DeAndre Foster.

#### **Building Champions**

Brad Willis is in his second season managing the club.

"I am excited for this season," he said. "We have 21 of 25 guys that just finished their high school careers and four that are already in college. It should be a great year of development for these kids to see what the college game is like before they actually get there."

#### KC Vipers

The Vipers finished seventh in the league last year in the regular season standings with an 15-15 record.

The manager is **Zach Norman**, while **Clint Culbertson** is the general manager.

#### **KC Bandits**

Pete Ingles is in his third year as the Bandits manager

"The Bandits return 10 players, five position players and five pitchers from last year's team, we will look to a combination of some the newcomers and veterans to provide leadership on the mound."

The pitchers mentioned by Ingles include right-hander **Ryan Romo** (Central Missouri), right-hander **Zach Gove** (Emporia State), right-hander **Mark Spreckels** (KCKCC), right-hander **Christian Witt** (Truman State) and right-hander **Ollie Kadey** (Missouri Western).



# **Blando inducted into BJ Hall of Fame**

Probably the most surprised person at the All-League Dinner Dec. 29 at the Westport Flea Market was Carl Blando.

The long-time scout and Ban Johnson manager was inducted into the Hall-of-Fame.

"It was beyond belief," he said. "I have a flair of being surprised when good things pop up in my life. I am thankful and very appreciative of being within a very select group of individuals."

Blando is the 36th person inducted into the Hall-of-Fame.

At present the south Kansas City resident is a parttime scout for the Kansas City Royals and an assistant coach at Rockhurst University.

The 76-year-old started as a part-time scout with the Royals in 1975 eventually earning full-time status in 1976

He spent 23 years with the Royals in various scouting capacities.

Blando finished his scouting career with the Milwaukee Brewers. He retired from scouting in 1999.

He got his start in mangaing in Senior 3&2 in Kansas

City and the Casey Stengel League.

He managed for several years in the Ban Johnson League with Butternut Bread.

"He possessed outstanding organizational skills, paid close attention to detail and was a real stickler for the fundamentals of baseball," **Jay DeSimone**, who coached Butternut with Blando, said. "He always placed the best interest of his players first."

Blando managed Butternut to Ban Johnson League titles in 1973, 1974 and 1975. His 1974 club won the City Championship.

During his 23 years as a full-time scout he signed a number of players that went on to make it to Major League Baseball.


Two names that come quickly to mind are pichers **David Cone** and **Danny Jackson**.


Cone is a member of the BJ Hall of Fame and the sponsor of the BJ Raiders.
