Building Champions grabs first title

CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

Make it a perfect ending for Building Champions.

The team finished fifth in the regular season, but came on strong in the post-season tournament, winning all seven games. This is the first title in just the third year in the league.

Building Champions beat the Milgram Mustangs in the quarterfinals and defending champion MSBL Royals in the semifinals.

And may have saved the best for last, winning the best of five championship series giving up just three earned runs.

Building Champions defeated the BJ Raiders 5-1 in the first game and blanked the Raiders 3-0 in the second contest.

In the final and decisive game, Building Champions was tied at 4-4 before exploding for eight runs in the bottom of the fourth inning to win going away 12-4.

Third-year Building Champions manager **Brad**Willis played for the BJ Raiders, winning

two titles under legendary manager Pat Nolan, who managed at the age of 94 in the BJ. Willis coached for five years for the Raiders before moving to Building Champions.

"The true honor for me is having my name near manager Pat Nolan," Willis said. "I got very close to him, and really enjoyed every moment of my time with

him. He was a true class act and one of the greatest people I have met in my life."

Looking at his championship team, he said, "All the credit goes to my team. They competed and really turned it on when they had to. I am so proud of them."

O'Rourke nabs MVP honors

Building Champions infielder/outfielder **Devin O'Rourke** was named by league officials as the MVP of the Championship Series.

He was five-of-10 in the three games with a double and an RBI.

"I just took the momentum from the season," the 2010 Rockhurst HS grad said. "My bat was popping real well and I had a good mindset. I tried not to let the pressure get to me."

O'Rourke batted .412 during the regular season. He will be attending St. Louis University to play baseball.

Manager Brad Willis said. "D.O. is a great player and had a great season for us from start to finish. He can play all three outfield positions and third base in a pinch. But as good as Devin is as a player, he is an even a better person."

Building Champions only allowed three earned runs in the three games of the Championship Series.

"Our pitchers were hitting their spots well," catcher **Sean McHugh**, a 2010 graduate of Blue Valley North, said. "They started off with strikes."

McHugh was the third-place hitter for the team and went one-for-three with a walk in the third and decisive game.

"I had a couple of good nights," he said. "It all comes down to having runners on base."

The veteran on the Building Champions team is infielder-pitcher **Matthew Garcia**.

This is his third year with Building Champions and he will be a junior this year at Pittsburg

He pitched the second game of the semifinals, an 8-1 win over defending champion MSBL Royals.

He was also three-for-four in the game and was a home run short of hitting for the cycle.

"The coaches and everyone came together at the end," he said of the team's seven-game winning streak to end the season.

Building Champions won the first game of the Championship series 5-1 behind the pitching of **Adam Giacalone** allowed five hits and fanning 10.

Cullen McRae is with the Florida Marlins. He serves as the club's video coordinator.


Carl Blando is with the Kansas City Royals organization. He had retired from scouting, but the Royals asked himto come back part-time and cover the Kansas City area.

Goldman remembers working on BJ book, "Diamond Connections"

This is the 10th anniverary of the Ban Johnson League book, "Diamond Connections."

The book written by **Stuart Goldman** was part of the celebration of the 75th anniversary of the league.

Goldman was the sports information director and editor of the BJ Beacon from 1992-1994. He also helped gather the information and did the program for the 75th Anniversary team in 2002.

He was approached by league officials about doing the book and started writing the book in 1999.

Goldman remembers talking to **David Cone** of the New York Yankees for the book during a series here at Kauffman Stadium and making a trip to St. Louis to interview **Rick Sutcliffe**.

He recalls that when he talked with various people about the book, they all seemed to mention **Les Milgram**. He knew he had to have something about Les in the book.

What surprised him the most about writing the book?

"There was a common theme that everyone who talked about the BJ, whether they played for one year or five, or whether they played in the majors or just had a solid professional life, had the utmost respect for the league," he said. "They all regarded the BJ as the highest level of baseball in Kansas City, and if you

BJ alum: Lapetina's 1955-59 Western Auto, 1965-69 were good in the BJ, you were really good. Most of the alums I talked to could recount games in detail from 20 or 30 years before, as if it were yesterday. Those games and those times meant so much to them."

Goldman is now managing editor of Club Industry magazine. He also spends some time working for the Royals as a tour guide and docent at the Royals Hall of Fame.

Goldman noted, "To me, the Ban Johnson League is the closest thing to a fraternity as I've ever been. I've been associated on and off with the Ban Johnson League for 18 years. That's an accomplishment I'm most proud of."
