Close race for spots continues

The weather has cooperated with a season without a plethora of rainouts, so far.

The result is a close race for the choice spots in the post-season tournament with nearly two-thirds of the season completed for most teams in the league.

The 13-team league has shown excellent balance and competitiveness in this the first year that the Ban Johnson League has ever had 13 teams.

The race for the top spot can not be any closer with the BJ Raiders and Milgram Mustangs virtually tied for first place.

The Raiders are ahead by percentage points with a 15-5 record in games through the Fourth of July. The Mustangs are 16-6 and tied in the games behind column with the Raiders.

Two of the three new teams are in third and fourth place in the current standings.

The Mac-N-Seitz Indians are in third with a

record of 11-7, three games behind the two leaders.

The Natural Baseball Academy is fourth with a record of 11-8. The team is 3.5 games behind the Raiders and Mustangs.

NKC Apartments has a record of 12-9, percentage points behind Natural Baseball Academy and 3.5 behind the leaders.

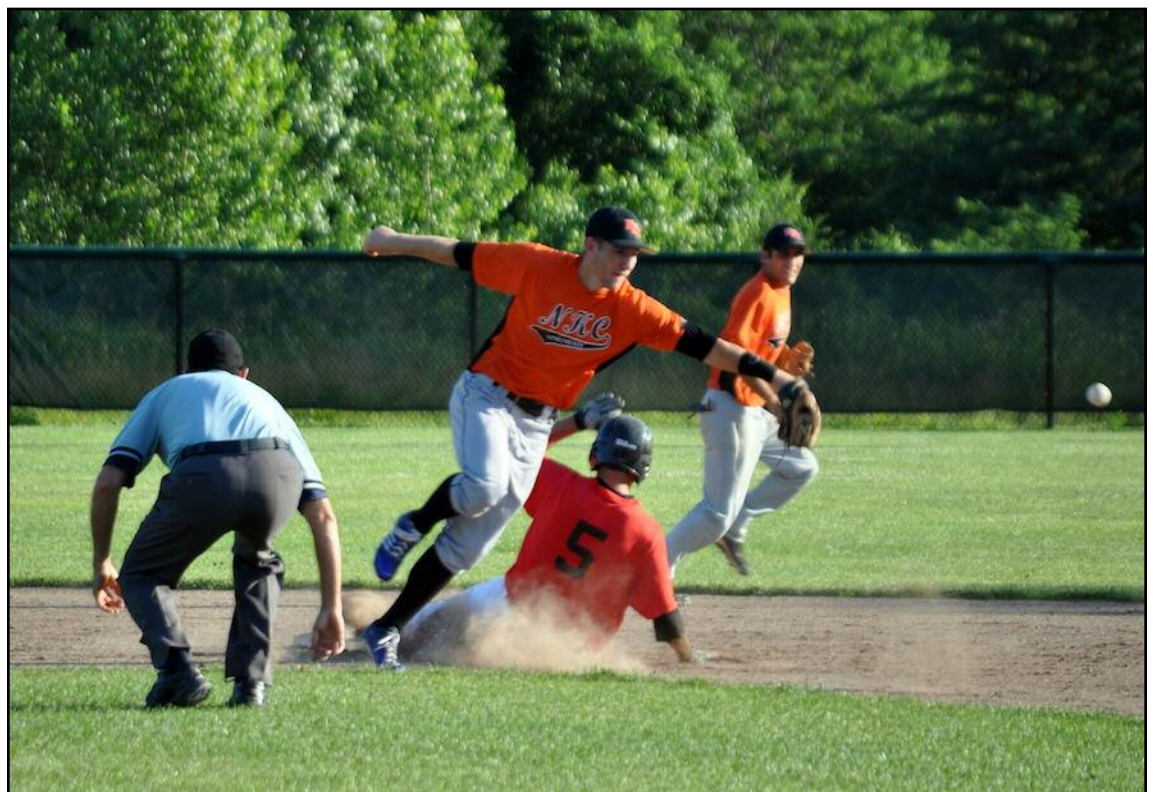
The MSBL Royals are in sixth with a record of 10-9.

There are two teams that are just barely under the .500 mark. The KC Blues have a record of 10-11 and defending champion Building Champions is at 8-9.

The Post-Season Tournament is slated to start sometime around July 15, This is dependent on rain and the makeup of rained out contests.

The annual All-Star Game is set for July 24 at Kauffman Stadium. The game will follow the Royals-Rays afternoon game.

New managers have learned a lot

The Ban Johnson League expanded to 13 teams this year, which means that there are several managers in the league for the first time.

The Beacon was able to talk to two of the new managers to get their impressions of their first year in the league.

Nolan Dietrich is the assistant baseball coach at Ottawa University and the first-year manager of first-year team Natural Baseball Academy.

“Our first year has gone well,” he said. “Many of our kids this summer either red-shirted or didn’t get much playing time this spring. They have used this summer opportunity to get valuable game experience for the upcoming college year.”

What is his impression of the Ban Johnson League?

“The Ban Johnson League is very compet-

itive and there are plenty of very good pitchers,” he said. “As a team, we have to be ready to compete each game day or the other teams in the league will beat you.”

Mac-N-Seitz Indians manager **Rob Jackson** has been coaching youth teams for the organization.

“I have enjoyed my first year in the Ban Johnson,” he said. “I have faced some challenges that I did not expect. In the past I have had teams that it was a top priority to be at every game and every practice. In the Ban Johnson League because of the schedule the players can have jobs, be out of town for several days in a row and the commitment to the team is not as high. This makes it hard for the team to find any rhythm, so every day is unpredictable of which team shows up. Better yet, which players are

BJ Raider pitchers hurl two no-hitters in a four days

It is unusual for a team to have a no-hitter during the Ban Johnson League season.

But the BJ Raiders didn't have just one no-hitter, they had two in the same week and almost had a third no-hitter.

The Raiders' **Nate Horton** tossed the first no-hitter on June 22 as the Raiders beat Regal Plastics 5-1 in the second game of a doubleheader.

The second no-hitter came on June 26 as the Raiders beat the KC Bandits 2-0. The no-hitter went to **Ryan Lawless**.

And in the second game of the doubleheader two Raider pitchers combined on a one-hitter in the 5-0 victory.

Horton struck out five and walked three in his no-hitter.

"I probably knew I had a no-hitter around the fourth inning, but it didn't really seem relevant at the time because it was early in the game," the Northwest Missouri State junior said. "Then Regal started trying to jinx me in the fifth so I knew I was getting in their head."

It was the first career no-hitter for Horton.

"My teammates contributed a huge amount," he said. "They made a ton of great plays behind me in clutch situations. It was also nice to have a nice lead so it took a lot of pressure off me."

"His performance was exciting to watch," manager **Mike Herr** said. "Every time he gets on the mound we know he is going to give us a great outing, but last night he was dealing and we could tell early on in the game that he had the potential to do something special."

Lawless was outstanding in no-hitting the Bandits on June 26.

The Hutchinson Community College right-handed pitcher fanned eight and just walked one batter.

Lawless is in his first year with the Raiders.

"Ryan did an outstanding job of keeping

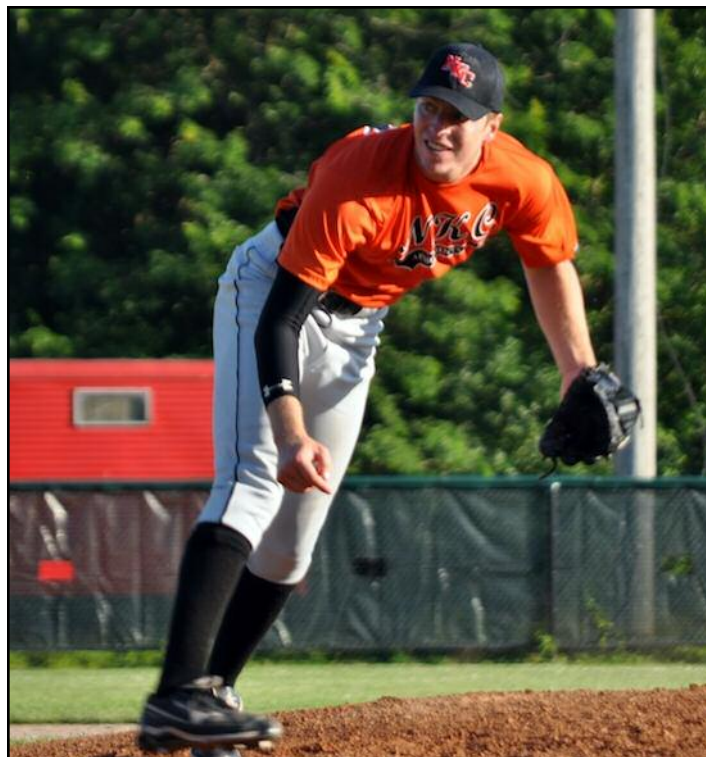

Gerшон has seen a lot of BJ history

David Gerшон has had extensive experience in the Ban Johnson League ranging from playing to coaching and running the front office.

He began playing as a pitcher for Guy's in 1965 at the age of 17.

"I remember it was early in the season and back then the league started early and many of the college players were not back in Kansas City," he said. "I got my first start against Katz, who had won the league the year before. It was an evening game at Klamm Park (in Kansas City, Kan.). I pitched a complete game and we won 12-0. I struck out 18, which stood as a league record for awhile. I figured I was well entrenched in the starting lineup. Wrong. **Roy Brown**, the manager, said, 'you are a rookie, and a rookie sits the bench and waits his turn.'"

Gerшон didn't start a game for the rest of the season.

"It was an honor to sit on the bench of a BJ team, let alone play," he said. "I was in the presence of some great ball players like teammate **Chuck Dobson** and I played against **Steve Mingori**, **Paul Lindblad** and **Steve Renko**."

Gerшон went to Missouri and then transferred to William Jewell, winning an NAIA National title in 1968.

"I signed with Oakland, and went to spring training in 1970, but never made it out of camp," he said.

He came back and was a pitching coach for **Don Motley** and Milgrams in 1970 and 1971

He resurrected his baseball career in 1987 pitching in the Men's Senior Baseball League, retiring in 2005.

In 2002, he became pitching coach and GM for NKC Apartments.

"Today, nine years later, I am happy to say I am still with NKC," he said. "Most recently, I have become more involved in the BJ working with Executive Director **Bob McFarlane**."

Gerшон is proud of his time in the BJ.

"A highlight for me while associated with the league has been working with many young men, who I have watched mature into not only great athletes, but matured as individuals," he said. "Two young men that I will remember always are **Bill Disselhoff**, now coaching at Park Hill South, and recently retired **Shay Colburn**, is seeking to coach at the high school level as well."

are going to be at each game.”

Jackson said that his schedule was heavy with games early and then not as many.

“I just wonder what would happen if the league were to play four or five nights in a row with nine inning games, how much better the games would be and if the players were able to do it,” he said.

He said he got to experience something special when his Indians played Regal Plastics on June 30.

“**Mike Rzeszut, Brendan Hensley and Ben Loughman** are all former players of mine that I coached for four years before they moved on to college,” he said. “Being

able to see them on the field again bigger, stronger and using what they learned while under my instruction was a great feeling. I even had to catch myself one inning when I almost yelled out to Mikey some encouragement while he was hitting against us.

“Overall, I can say that has been the best part of managing in the BJ, reuniting with all the players that I have coached, done lessons with, and competed against while they were in high school. Most all of them have met me after the game to catch up and it has been nice to know that I have been part of their baseball career.
