Seaboard wins title; makes history

You might call Seaboard the comeback kids.

The club finished an unprecedented run through the championship tournament with a 5-2 victory over UMB Bank on July 30 at the Mid-America

Sports Complex in Shawnee.

The victory gave the team the championship series title 3-1. This is just the sixth year that Seaboard has been in the Ban Johnson League.

Seaboard finished the regular season with a record of 12-14, becoming the first team to have a losing record in the regular season and coming back to win the championship series.

Seaboard has to labor through play in round, beating defending champion

Building Champions and the KC Blues to advance to the quarterfinals.

They lost the first quarterfinal game to the regular season champion BJ Raiders, but won the next two.

In the semi-finals, Seaboard dropped the first game to Mac-N-

Seitz, but came back to win the next

two.

And they lost the first game of the championship series with UMB Bank.

Kevin Joyce of the MSBL Royals added RBI singles.


The B's scored a run in the top of the fifth, but the J's came back with two runs with both coming on a two-out booming triple by Building Champions' Andrew Kreiling.

Seaboard won the next three games to capture its first Ban Johnson League title.

The club trailed 2-0 in the first inning, but came back with single runs in the second and third innings. They took the lead with two runs in the fifth frame.

What was the secret of their post-season success?

"We got everyone on the same page," firstyer manager **Brian McCulloch** said. "We underachieved early in the year, but everyone showed up every day ready to play. This (championship) is what the guys wanted."

Catcher **Kyle Pener** added, "Everyone turned on the effort level in the playoffs. We
