YOU CAN HAVE CONTACT WITH A COACH OFF OF THEIR CAMPUS

THIS MEANS YOU CAN VISIT THE COACH OFF THEIR COLLEGE CAMPUS.

YOU CAN CALL COACHES AT YOUR EXPENSE

COLLEGE COACHES MAY CALL YOU

REMEMBER, YOU ARE ALWAYS ALLOWED TO CALL COACHES, BUT THERE ARE SEVERAL RESTRICTIONS ABOUT WHEN THEY CAN CALL YOU. TECHNICALLY, DIII COACHES CAN CALL AT ANY TIME, ALTHOUGH MANY FOLLOW THE DI RULES.

YOU CAN TAKE OFFICIAL VISITS

AN OFFICIAL VISITS IS ANY VISIT TO A COLLEGE CAMPUS BY YOU AND YOUR PARENTS PAID FOR BY THE COLLEGE

DIVISION I: OPENING DAY OF CLASS SENIOR YEAR. LIMITED TO 1 VISIT PER COLLEGE, UP TO 5 TOTAL.

DIVISION II: JUNE 15TH AFTER SOPHOMORE YEAR. LIMITED TO 1 VISIT PER COLLEGE, UNLIMITED.

DIVISION III: JANUARY 1ST OF JUNIOR YEAR. LIMITED TO 1 VISIT PER COLLEGE, UNLIMITED.

NAIA: ANYTIME, UNLIMITED.

ACADEMIC-ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS: DIVISION I

If you want to participate in athletics or receive an athletic scholarship during your first year, you must:

- Graduate from high school
- Complete these 16 core courses:
 - 4 years of English
 - 3 years of math (Algebra 1 or higher)
 - 2 years of natural or physical science (including one year of lab science if offered by your high school)
 - 1 extra year of English, math or natural or physical science
 - 2 years of social science
 - 4 years of extra core courses (from any category above, or foreign language, comparative religion or philosophy)
- Earn a minimum required grade point average in your core courses
- Earn a combined SAT or ACT score that matches your core-course grade-point average and test score sliding scale (for example, 2.400 core-course grade-point average needs an 860 SAT)

Requirement to graduate with your high school class

You must complete the 16 core-course requirement in eight semesters, which begins when you initially started high school with your ninth-grade class. If you graduate from high school in eight semesters with your class, you may use one core-course unit completed within one year after graduation (summer or academic year) to meet NCAA Division I initial eligibility requirements.

You may complete the core course at a location other than the high school from which you graduate and may initially enroll full time at a college or university at any time after completion of the core course.

Test Score Requirements

SAT and ACT Requirements

You must achieve the required score on the SAT or ACT before full-time collegiate enrollment. You must do this whether you are a citizen of the United States or an international country. Also, state-administered ACT exams will be accepted by the NCAA Eligibility Center.

Note: An inquiry may be submitted to the testing agency if there is an inconsistency between your academic record and your standardized examination score (e.g., core grade-point average versus ACT or SAT score) or multiple standardized examination scores (e.g., ACT versus SAT).

Remember: All SAT and ACT scores must be reported to the NCAA Eligibility Center directly from the testing agency. Test scores reported on a high school transcript will not be accepted.

When registering for the SAT or ACT, input the NCAA Eligibility Center code of 9999 to make sure the score is reported directly from the testing agency to the NCAA Eligibility Center.

ACADEMIC REDSHIRT

NOTE: To compete in Division I, students enrolling on or after August 1, 2016 must earn a minimum 2.300 GPA in 16 core courses, 10 of which must be completed before the start of the seventh semester [seven of those 10 courses will become locked in for purposes of GPA calculation], and must earn a combined SAT or ACT score that matches your core-course GPA on the sliding scale above. The required 10 core courses prior to the start of the seventh semester and the "locked in" courses do not apply to academic redshirts [GPA between 2.000-2.299].
