

LITTLE LEAGUE ALL-STAR TEAMS AND ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Player Eligibility

Players are eligible for participation on an SBLL All-Star team, provided they meet the criteria established in the following:

8/9/10 Year Old Division: Any player League Age 8, 9 or 10, with amateur status, who has participated as an eligible player in 60 percent (60%) of the regular season games as of June 15, on a Majors or Minors Division team and who meets Little League residency or school eligibility requirements may be selected to play on the 8/9/10 Year Old All-Star Team.

9/10/11 Year Old Division: Any player League Age 9, 10 or 11, with amateur status, who has participated as an eligible player in 60 percent (60%) of the regular season games as of June 15, on a Majors or Minors Division team and who meets Little League residency or school eligibility requirements may be selected to play on the 9/10/11 Year Old All-Star Team.

Little League (Majors) Division: Any player League Age 10,11 or 12, with amateur status, who has participated as an eligible player in 60 percent (60%) of the regular season games as of June 15, on a Majors or Minors Division team and who meets Little League residency or school eligibility requirements may be selected to play on the Majors All-Star Team.

Players may only be rostered to one (1) All-Star team.

The 60% play rule may be waived by the SBLL Board of Directors, permitting a player to be eligible for selection, provided a physician’s note documenting an injury or illness prior to or during the current season prohibiting his/her participation and such note releases the player from the balance of the Regular Season and/or All-Star Tournament play.

Only players who reside or go to school within the SBLL League Boundaries are eligible to play on an All-Star team.

Any player who does not reside in or the school where they attend classes is not WITHIN the league’s boundaries must have a approved waiver issued by the Charter Committee at Little League International.
